#### **Opening:**

The regular meeting of the ADSC Mid-Atlantic Chapter was called to order at 12:43 p.m. on June 2, 2010 in the Holiday Inn, BWI Airport, Maryland by President Matt Klanica

#### **A. Approval of Agenda**

The agenda was unanimously approved as distributed electronically.

#### **B. Approval of Minutes**

Matt Klanica made a motion to approve the previous meeting. Mike Koller seconded. The minutes of the previous meeting were unanimously approved.

#### **C. Open Issues**

##### Treasurer's Report

1. Bank account has approximately \$51,416.
2. The chapter had receipts less than \$25,000 in 2009, and as such did file electronically, Form 990-N,
3. Andy Steele has our chapter mailing list and will be sending our nominal chapter dues of \$1.00 for 2010 ONLY, as to not substantially increase the treasury, and to promote new memberships.

##### National Report

1. Crane vs. drill rig roundtable discussion: a company's personnel need to be trained in the use of cranes if the drill rig is being used as a crane. OSHA has hired 2000 inspectors in order to be diligent. ADSC does not recommend using your drill rig as a crane. Your ADSC equipment manufacturers will be helpful in procuring new operating manuals if you are in need of one. Rick Marshall will be updating the membership at the summer board meeting on the latest from OSHA relating to this issue.
2. By-laws revisions are up for a vote at the summer meeting; after these have been approved, each chapter will be expected to update their by-laws to match the national by-laws. Some items are required to be followed by both national and chapter.
3. Drilled Shaft Safety Manual is being turned into ANSI in order to create a recognized standard for our membership.
4. Requests for advertising in the National Directory have been issued.
5. ADSC Summer meeting will be July 21-24 in Colorado Springs, CO.
6. DROS in Casagrande's yard in September 10<sup>th</sup>-17<sup>th</sup> in Lafayette, NJ.
7. Foundations of Leadership Workshop – first two days September 29-30, second two days February 24-25.

8. Outreach – let Tony know names and contact information of university professors or engineering professionals that could benefit by the information available from ADSC.
9. ACI 336 is currently in ballot; is possible that it could go back to discussion.
10. Tony requested members forward to him any specifications that he could help rectify.
11. John Bonita noted that the 2009 IBC code defined drilled shafts socketed to rock as requiring a permanent steel casing to bedrock (Chapter 18 Soil and Foundations Design, Section 1802.1 & 1810.3.9.6) Going forward, this may become an issue on Corps of Engineers or other public projects or even private projects. It is possible micropiles are being confused with drilled shafts in this specification. Tony will look into this for us.

Guest of Honor – National President Tom Witherspoon:

1. Tom is on the ADSC chapter circuit and is calling each contractor member during his presidency. He is always available to discuss ADSC matters.

Strategic Planning Committee

The committee met before this meeting and came up with three goals for the chapter:

1. Drilled Shaft or other seminar; not necessarily DOT targeted.
2. Outreach to universities and private engineering firms – start with VA Tech and use ADSC’s Faculty Workshop CD.
3. Rigging class through Indusco; will cover Maryland’s new certified rigger standards. No date has been set. Mike Koller recommended we set Saturday, September 25<sup>th</sup> and will confirm with Indusco’s trainer the date and location.

Chapter Report

1. Joint Marketing Event – April 21<sup>st</sup> in Baltimore; Shana Opdyke was very involved. Mike Koller thought it was a great marketing event and manned the ADSC booth. Mike noticed great interest in the ADSC library.
